Who we are


We are Coney Ltd, a registered charity (no. 1156864) and company limited by guarantee (no. 06713686), registered at Unit 15 Toynbee Studios, 28 Commercial Street, London, UK, E1 6AB.

Who you are

You are an individual who has interacted with Coney in one or more of these ways (please note, this list is not exhaustive):

- Used Coney's website (which is currently at www.coneyhq.org)
- Asked to join our mailing list or our Network
- Completed an online or paper feedback form or survey
- Contacted us via email or interacted with us on social media
- Donated money to Coney online (including through a third party like Kickstarter, PayPal, MyDonate or JustGiving), or by bank transfer, cheque, cash or services in kind
- Booked to attend a Coney performance, adventure or event
- Participated in a Coney project (or are the parent or guardian of a child under the age of 18 who has participated in a Coney project)
- Been nominated by someone you know to receive a Coney adventure
- Been selected by Coney to receive a surprise message, adventure or gift, using publicly available contact details
- Texted a mobile phone number owned by Coney to begin an adventure through the Magic Phone platform
- Told another company that they can pass information about you to Coney

This privacy policy does not cover personal data we hold about you an employee, trustee, supplier, freelancer or sole trader who we work with or have discussed working with.



What data we may hold about you


Data we hold about you may include:

- Photographs and videos taken during a Coney project or event
- Information you gave us in an online or paper form (such as feedback, contact details, and information like your age, ethnicity and gender)
- Details of Coney performances and events you have attended, and purchases or donations you have made. These may include information available through services we use to process bookings, donations and payments, currently Eventbrite, PayPal, Kickstarter, iZettle and MyDonate.
- Communications with us (such as emails and notes of phone calls) and any information you send us via email (such as your CV)
- Information you gave to Coney (or to an alias of Coney, for example via our Magic Phone Platform) during the course of a project or event, in order for us to create an interactive experience (such as a questionnaire to get to know you better in advance of attending). We will only use this data in order to deliver the experience and will delete it as soon as it is no longer needed.
- Your publicly available social media activity and interactions with Coney (such as your Twitter handle, posts about us, and your location)
- Publicly available information we have discovered about you through research, in the course of delivering a Coney adventure or project you signed up for, or for which a friend referred you. Using the principle of loveliness, we will make sure information collected is appropriate, and will use it only as long as required to deliver your adventure.

How we use data about you

We collect and hold data about you so we can do things like:

- Create and deliver experiences, adventures, and performances. Our work is interactive, so we often need to know a bit about you to make it possible. The way we use your data varies between projects, but always follows Coney's principles of adventure, curiosity and loveliness.
- Learn from your experience and feedback, to develop our work and tailor it to our audiences and participants
- Keep track of who has come to which Coney events and adventures
- Personalise the communications you receive from us
- Manage our organisation effectively at an administrative level
- Record who has given money or services to us, so we can keep you informed about how this has impacted our work, and claim GiftAid where possible
- Keep in touch with you as someone who may want to collaborate with us
- Send you information about Coney, our events and ways to support us. Depending on what you have asked to hear about, this may include:



- Sending you messages about Coney's work, events and performances, ways to support us, and occasional details about work by our friends
- Updating you about projects you have previously been involved in
- Sending you event invitations, news and opportunities specifically relating to Coney's Network
- Share with other people and organisations the feedback you have given us, in order to promote Coney's work and report on our impact.

Use of anonymous data

We share statistics about our audiences and participants with third parties (such as Arts Council England and venue partners) to report on our work, which may include data you gave us in a form. This kind of information will always be anonymised before it is shared with any third parties and is therefore no longer personal data.

We use a third-party provider, CiviCRM, to deliver our newsletters. Through this we gather statistics about email opening and clicks.


Cookies

Cookies are small files placed on your computer by a website to collect standard internet log data and learn about the behaviour of visitors. For more information about cookies, including how to turn them off, visit <u>www.aboutcookies.org</u>.

When you access www.coneyhq.org, you will be given the choice to allow all cookies, or to restrict tracking cookies and only allow required cookies. If you have previously consented to the use of cookies but wish to withdraw your consent, please do this by emailing us at knock@coneyhq.org. However, if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including "strictly necessary" cookies) you may not be able to access all or parts of the website.

We use Google Analytics to collect basic log information and details of what visitors do on our website, as well as information provided by your computer, like your browser type. This data is anonymised, and we will never attempt to find out the identities of those visiting our website.

We use online advertising to keep you aware of what we're up to as well as upcoming events. Like many companies, we may target you with ads when you use other websites and apps, based on your Contact, Technical, Usage and Profile Data. We do this using a variety of digital marketing networks and ad exchanges, and a range of advertising technologies such as pixels, ad tags, and cookies, as well as specific services offered by some sites and social networks, such as Facebook's Custom Audience Service.



We use a range of analytics and targeted advertising tools to display relevant advertisements on other websites and apps (as described above) to you, deliver relevant content to you in marketing communications (where applicable), and to measure the effectiveness of the advertising provided. For example, we use Google Analytics to analyse Google's interest-based advertising data and/or third-party audience data (such as age, marital status, life event, gender and interests) to target and improve our marketing campaigns, marketing strategies and website content. We may also use tools provided by other third parties, such as Facebook, Content Square, Adroll, Responsys, Criteo and Bing to perform similar tasks, using your Contact, Technical, Usage and Profile Data.

Children and young people

Coney is committed to the welfare needs of all children, young people and vulnerable adults who work with Coney, whether they are participating in Coney workshops or are performers or makers on Coney projects. We aim to create intimate, respectful and trusting relationships between everyone involved. Coney is committed to a creative process which:

- Places the welfare of children, young people and vulnerable adults first;
- Respects the rights, wishes and feelings of young people, vulnerable adults and all with whom we are working
- Promotes the welfare of all people we work with and their protection within a relationship of trust;
- Ensures best health and safety practice.

In our participation projects, we may collect data about the people taking part, including children & young people. We will seek consent from a parent or guardian before collecting data about children.


In order to deliver projects and keep participants safe, we may need information like medical details, school information, access requirements and notes and feedback on participants' work with Coney. This may be passed to emergency services if necessary.

For people under 16 years old, Coney will use a nominated adult as a first point of communication, switching to the child on consent from that nominated adult or where needed to fulfil a contract.

How we keep your data safe, and who sees it

To protect your privacy, we make sure your data is kept securely and access is restricted to appropriately trained staff who need to use it for the processes outlined in this policy. We will keep and process your data for long enough to fulfil the purpose we collected it for. After that point, we will dispose of in a secure manner.

We will never sell your data, but it may be processed by limited third parties in the course of achieving the purposes listed above. Third parties that may



process your data for us include payment platforms, venues who need the names of bookers, ticket sites, and companies who store our data.

We will never share your contact details or sensitive personal data with other organisations or people without your consent, unless legally required to do so.

Some of our suppliers run their operations outside the European Economic Area (EEA). This means they may not be subject to same data protection laws as companies based in the UK, but we will take appropriate steps to make sure they provide a level of protection that meets the requirements of UK data protection law.

We may share information about you with law enforcement agencies and other organisations or individuals if we are required to by law.

Contacting us, access to your data, and your right of correction or erasure We want to make sure that the data we hold about you is accurate and up to date, and you can ask us at any time to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to 'forget' you, by erasing the data we hold about you as far as reasonably possible. If you would like us to do this, please get in touch on knock@coneyhq.org.

You have the legal right to request a copy of the data that we hold about you. If you would like a copy of some or all of the information we hold about you, please email knock@coneyhq.org.

Opting out of marketing

We may communicate with you about ourselves, our events, ways to support us and other Coney loveliness. We will usually only do this if you tell us we can, for example by joining our mailing list online, or by asking us to add you to our Network. If you aren't on our mailing list, but you have previously attended or enquired about a Coney event or adventure, we may occasionally get in touch about similar projects we think you'll want to know about.

You have the right to tell us to stop contacting you for marketing purposes at any time. If you want to opt out, just email knock@coneyhq.org to let us know, or click 'unsubscribe' within the email we have sent you.
